1. 7:05 p.m. Attendance

- 3. 7:08 p.m. Toben introduced and welcomed the new police department liaison, Sgt. Chris Dumais, and thanked the outgoing representative, Lt. Leonard.
- 4. 7:09 p.m. Email Correspondence presented by Marjorie Mitlin, Correspondence Clerk: 11/9/23 Contacted by Don Williams, letting people know about the Sharon Historical Society's Open House on Saturday, Nov. 25th from 2-4:00. They will be having a speaker: Joe Blansfield who will talk about his year in Iraq working in a combat support hospital.
 - 11/12/23 The Mass Housing Authority Educators contacted us about a program teaching about the ABC's of The Immigration Survey. This is a resource which will teach about the best practices of how to engage with Sharon's New Families.
 - 11/13/23 Toben updated the calendar of event and observances. They also shared the slides from Thursday's meeting at the Historical Society's Veteran's event.
 - 12/1/23 Tom Wu and Wilma Yuen contacted us. Informing us about a Cottage Street school child who was allegedly being neglected in the town. According to them, DCF was contacted.
 - 12/1/23 Leandra McLean informed the DEIC about a presentation by Dr. Chris Lewis who would share the results of the survey done by 410 community members

looking into perceived and actual results of the use of alcohol, drugs, cigarettes, and vaping. mental health results were also compiled. All of the results were compared to the Youth Risk Behavior Survey done previously.

12/6/23 Email from Gamal Abdelkader talking about the School Committee's meeting on Dec. 6th. He acknowledged Avi Shemtov's,\aplology, which he said was well received by the signatories. They felt heard and understood, but they were frustrated that the situation did not appear on the agenda, and a discussion would have to be put off until the next meeting. Although they appreciate Avi's apology, they still feel that more needs to be done in terms of tightening up the social media policy and future required DEI training.

12/12/23 Toben sent out the agenda for tonight's DEIC board meeting.

5. 7:12 p.m. Approval of minutes from three meetings:

April 11/9/2023. Margie motioned and Shelley Keimach seconded that the minutes of April 9, 2023 be approved. 7 in favor, 2 abstentions by persons who were not part of the committee in April 2023.

May 11, 2023. Lajos Kamocsay motioned and Margie seconded that the minutes of May 11, 2023 be approved. 8 in favor. 1 abstention (not yet a member).

November 9, 2023. Kim Hokanson motioned and Shelley seconded that the minutes of November 9, 2023 be approved. The minutes were unanimously approved.

6. 7: 17 p.m. Sharon Pluralism Network (SPN) is planning a very brief silent vigil to bring people together at the lake on January 7, 2024. No tee shirts, signs, posters. There was a lengthy discussion about insurance. The board of SPN is concerned about having an event without insurance. One quote for insurance was about \$500. A long discussion followed about sponsorship and about insurance, including prior events that might offer precedents. The question arose about what offering our sponsorship means in terms of liability. We did not have insurance when Darius Coombs spoke at the Unitarian Church. The discussion concluded without a vote.

5. 7:54 p.m. DEI Training for members of committees and boards.

Bill Kondrath stated that a first draft of a contract with SunShower Learning is in the works. The draft contract is for 125 people and 4 months offering one course on "Disarming Microaggressions" for boards and elected officials. The cost is \$2312.50 or \$18.50 per person. The committees named did not include the DEIC. Toben is in communication with Kiana Pierre-Louis and Fred Turkington. As a trainer and researcher, Kim asked about pre- and post- testing to measure the training effectiveness. There is none. Lajos asked if having a town DEI director would enable more follow-up, compliance, and support.

6. 8:07 Sharon's New Residents. Kim was at the meeting today and she reported the residents will be moving from the Econo Lodge to the Best Western with the help of the National Guard. Shelley has helped to set up classes in English at the Chinese Church. People seem to be feeling more stable. We will be getting more residents as well (from other sites in MA).

7: 8:12 Social Media Policy passed by Select Board for town appointed and elected officials. This policy is for town employees while they are working. It is not for town committees or for elected officials. The policy is for town employees. And it is about town websites for the most part. And guidance for them on their own personal websites.

When free speech harms someone on social media, we need to attend to it. The School Board chair has apologized numerous times and, I (Toben) think did the work to repair. He also went out into the community and met with the various stakeholders who signed the letter to the SB. He also met with the Imam of the mosque who felt harmed.

Appointed committee members come up for re-appointment and this is the occasion to bring up behaviors of members before they are reappointed.

There is not a statement on our webpage inviting people to reach out to us with concerns they have about harmful statements and actions. (Maybe there should be.) How we can better support our town members.

It would be appropriate for us to acknowledge correspondence sent to us directly with a formal response to the sender and that a summary will be made of the correspondence at the next meeting. Margie acknowledged that she would do that. When we are cc-ed on things, it may not be necessary.

8:26 Brief Summary: SSPARC (Sharon Substance Prevention and Resource Coalition) survey results. Dr. Chris Lewis (psychologist) has worked with SSPARC for 3-4 years. He received 110 surveys. This was more than previous years. What are youth patterns re drug and alcohol abuse and mental health. The largest problem seems to be alcohol. Not vaping. Depression and anxiety among young people seem to be high. The marijuana dispensary does not seem to have increased problems with marijuana. It seems that people are having trouble accessing resources for reasonable costs.

INTERFACE—mental health referral service—is available to people in Sharon. The program will help individuals find a referral. Leandra McLean, town nurse, is publicizing this. Every year a Youth Risk Behavior Survey (YRBS) is done. This was compared to the survey that Chris Lewis did.

8:37 We are due to have a town report in January. The chair asked for topics that should be included and asked that committee members send them topics soon for inclusion. Some items to include: Indigenous People's Day, Sharon Day, Juneteenth, Social Media Policy draft, training module for committee and board members, strategic planning, Thanksgiving event sponsored by Sharon Interfaith Clergy, Ruby Bridges Walk to School Day, recommendation for full-time town DEI director, Foxboro Mascot discussion, co-sponsor Sharon Pride, number of letters/emails received (Allison and Margie to add number of correspondences),

8:47 Strategic plan update. We may discuss, at our next meeting, serving as liaisons other committees and boards. We might think more about orienting new members. Shelley is working on Juneteenth, looking for more traction.




