



**RESIDENT NOTICE**  
**SHARON- MWRA PUMP STATION AND WATER MAIN**

Dear Resident,

The Town of Sharon is constructing a 1,100 square foot water pump station at 25 Tiot Street and installing approximately 5,000 linear feet of 12-inch water main from Tiot Street through Edge Hill Road to Norwood Street. The water main installation will also occur in a small section of Union Street in Norwood.

The water pump station will provide important resiliency to the Town of Sharon's water infrastructure, serving as an emergency hydraulic interconnection between Sharon and Norwood, which can be utilized by the Town of Sharon in the event of a drought or other emergency situation.

Barbato Construction, Co., Inc. will be constructing this project, beginning September 2020 and is scheduled to complete it by the end of October 2021. Construction will be conducted Monday through Friday, between the hours of 7:00 AM and 3:30 PM.

***HOW WILL THIS WORK AFFECT YOU?***

During water main installation, there may be disturbance to traffic patterns and flow within the work area. Please obey all traffic control devices and police details to protect yourself and the construction workers. Please note, school buses will be provided access through the work area and prior coordination with the school bus system will be made to ensure scheduling impacts are limited. Residents of Edge Hill Road and Tiot Street will be allowed access to the work area but may be slightly inconvenienced by the presence of construction equipment and material excavations. Additionally, access to an individual's driveway may be limited or blocked for a short period of time. The Contractor will work with you to ensure the inconvenience will be as minor as possible. All roadways will be swept and be cleared of debris at the end of each working day.
